



# Cheltenham & District Riding Club Summer Show 2010



## Ring 1 – Showing 09.30 start

### **Class 1 – In Hand Best Turned Out Pony Not exceeding 15H, Including Special prize for Best Turned Out Youngster**

Open to any age, youngster is deemed under 3 years of age on date of show. Judged on presentation of handler and horse, manners and behaviour.

### **Class 2 – In Hand Best Turned out Horse exceeding 15H, Including a Special Prizes for Best Turned out Youngster**

Open to any age, youngster is deemed under 3 years of age on date of show. Judged on presentation of handler and horse, manners and behaviour.

### **Class 3 – In hand Fancy Dress horse or pony**

The theme is 'films', so decorate you and your horse or pony as you choose to wow the judges! Judged on inventiveness and Imagination! Will be split into horses & ponies if sufficient entries

### **Class 4 – In Hand Veteran**

Open to horse or ponies aged 16 years or over

### **Class 5 – In Hand Coloured Horse or Pony**

Open to any tricoloured, pie or skewbald, dun, spotted or palomino coloured horse or pony. Judged on temperament, conformation, markings and evenness of colour. Will be split into horses & ponies if sufficient entries

### **Class 6 – In Hand Mountain & Moorland**

Open to any native breed, will be split if sufficient Entries. Judged on conformation, manners, suitability and presentation

**In hand Showing Championship for classes 4, 5 & 6 will be immediately before lunch**

*Lunch (pm session will not start before 13.30)*

### **Class 7 – Ridden family horse/ pony**

Horse or pony to be presented by 2 riders with at least a 15 year age gap. Judged on manners, performance, personality and suitability

### **Class 8 – Ridden Mountain & Moorland**

Open to any native breed, Judged on conformation, manners, suitability and Presentation. Will be split into horses & ponies if sufficient entries

### **Class 9 – Ridden Coloured horse or pony**

Open to any tricoloured, pie or skewbald, dun, spotted or palomino coloured horse or pony. Judged on temperament, conformation, markings and evenness of colour. Will be split into horses & ponies if sufficient entries

### **Class 10 – Ridden Hunter type horse or pony**

Judged on suitability, presentation, conformation and manners

### **Class 11 – Ridden Riding Club Horse or Pony, including former Racehorses**

Will be required to jump a small fence. Judged on suitability, presentation, conformation and manners. Special prizes for the best entrants which are Wetherby's registered, they do not have to have raced, but must hold a Wetherby's passport – this must be presented to the secretaries when entering.

**Ridden Showing Championship will take place once all ridden showing classes have been completed.**

## Ring 2 – Working Hunter Classes 09.30 start

### **Class 12 – Novice Working Hunter Pony**

Height not exceeding 2'3"

### **Class 13 – Novice Working Hunter Horse**

Height not exceeding 2'6"

### **Class 14 – Open Working Hunter Pony**

Height not exceeding 2'9"

### **Class 15 – Open Working Hunter Horse**

Height not exceeding 3'

**Class 16 – Mountain & Moorland Working Hunter**, height not exceeding 2'3". Specifically for native breeds only, any height of pony

All working hunter classes will be required to jump a rustic course of fences followed an individual show presentation of the horse to the judge.

*Lunch (pm session will not start before 13.30)*

### **Class 17 – Rustic Chase-me-charlie**

Here's one for the adventurous, 2 fences and you nominate a fence to raise the height of, every time you jump clear you go into the next round, the winner is the last horse and rider to clear the course – simple and lots of fun! **Starting height 2'3"**

## Ring 3 – Show Jumping 09.00 start

**Class 18 – Mini Show jumping** fences not exceeding 2'0"

**Class 19 – Novice Show Jumping** fences not exceeding 2'6"

**Class 20 – Intermediate Show jumping** fences not exceeding 2'9"

*Lunch (class 20 will not start before 13.30)*

**Class 21 – Open show jumping** fences not exceeding 3'3"

**Class 22 – BRC Novice R1 Top Score qualifier**, 60 seconds to gain the highest score, max height 2'9 (ran under BRC rules) (includes a non qualifying section for Non BRC members)

**Class 23 – BRC Intermediate R1 Top Score Qualifier**, 60 seconds to gain the highest score. Max height 3'6" (Ran under BRC rules) (Includes a non qualifying section for non BRC members)

*Competitors are only permitted to jump a maximum of 2 classes on any 1 horse from classes 18 – 20. Any combinations of horse size/ rider age is permitted.*

**Horses competing in class 22 may not also compete in class 23**

**Please note, horses or ponies under 3 years of age are only permitted to compete in classes 1 or 2**

## Ring 4 ~ Clear Round Show Jumping (09.00 start)

Available all day, heights will vary, increasing as the day progresses. Rosettes to all clears £3.00 per round

### Ring 5 – Dressage 09.30 start (Judge Beth Franz)

Class 24 – BD Intro B Walk & Trot test (R1/O)

Class 25 – P12 (R2/O)

Class 26 – N24

#### Restrictions

R1: Horse & rider not to have been placed in a dressage competition

R2: Horse & rider never to have been placed 1st - 3rd in a P12 DR test

O: Open to all

*Please specify on your entry form if you are open or restricted,  
if you do not specify you will be put in the open section*

*Please ensure you present your passport to the  
secretaries for classes which specify the horses age.  
For BRC Top Score, passports must be presented to  
the Official Steward for flu vac checking.*
